

Settling into opening worsnip, cierk read aloud the queries for 12th month:

Witness and Civic Responsibility. Responses shared aloud included

- In our full name, Friends of Truth, there's the sense that there's not <u>only one way</u> <u>forward</u>, but that we're challenged to find <u>our</u> way forward.
- "Salvaging the Sense of the Meeting" Pendle Hill Pamphlet that Friendly Circle has been examining explores pathways toward recognizing our communal way forward.
- WFS Board of Trustees heard from two enthusiastic WFS teachers about Project-Based Learning. They begin with questions and involve students in building the skill-sets, the bridges, toward completion of their projects.

Minutes of Monthly Meeting for Business held 11-14-2021 accepted.

**Westfield Friends School Report** - Stephanie Judson, clerk of the WFSchool Board of Trustees, reviewed the written report that was circulated before our 11/14 Meeting for Business and invited questions.

-The New Jersey Association for Independent Schools, (NJAIS) in reviewing the WFS application for accreditation, noted we lacked a policy on DEIB (Diversity, Equality,

Inclusion, Belonging). Stephanie read the policy the Board approved at the December Board meeting; it is appended to these minutes.

- -The WFS Development Committee plans a January 25 event to include local business owners and business owners within the WFS and WMM communities. A pamphlet will be prepared to facilitate utilization of these services and businesses.
- -Finally, the Board appreciates the Meeting's significant spiritual and practical support.

### **Naming Committee for Nominating Committee**

Alvin Figueroa and Michael Robinson serving as *ad hoc* naming committee to bring up to 3 our standing Nominating Committee, recommend Mike Lane and Karen Nulton. (Suzanne has rotated off and Doren has asked to be released.)

These nominations will be carried over for a month before approval.

**Worship and Religious Education** - Suzanne Day explained that the COVID Guidelines our Meeting approved in June included that the Guidelines would be revised as conditions changed. When the weather became cold, June Guidelines no longer represented the needs of the community and now Meeting has asked our committee for refreshed Guidelines.

Nancy Robinson read the proposed Guidelines developed by the Committee [which had been summarized on signs posted at entry, and which are appended below these minutes.] One member's anguish over masking and many members' respect for communal caring and data-driven regional conditions led our clerk to ask the committee to return next month with Guidelines which specifically note current and local COVID recommendations. It was agreed to begin at once having those at meeting in person sign in for possible contact-tracing. The clerk asked for a time of quiet.

**Outreach Committee** - Gail Fountaine, who sends birthday cards to members, plans to use WFS students' art instead of purchasing commercial cards. She asked for approval of the copying and paper supply costs. Approval of the Meeting is not necessary as long as the cost is covered by the Outreach Committee's budget. The members appreciated Gail's idea of utilizing WFS artwork.

Gail also invited those interested to attend a presentation by SG23 Design, a potential vendor we might engage to manage our WMM web-presence for a fee. Some members recommended a Facebook presence for sharing community news, such as RiverTownsPeople.

Peace and Social Concerns - Moon Beiferman-Hanies, noting the committee now meets 3rd Tuesday evenings, asked about our engagement with Bread-of-Life Food Pantry. Any donations brought to Meetinghouse the will see to getting delivered. She also brought forward the Meeting support for the John Woolman Memorial. During this fiscal year, any committee can make a contribution from their budget. For the Meeting to make a contribution, a proposed amount needs to be brought to the Meeting as the 2022-2023 fiscal year budget is prepared in the Spring

**Property Committee** Bill Beetle announced that our PSE&G estimated monthly cost will be \$100 less each month than anticipated when budget was approved. The project contractor provided actual new equipment costs to calculate WMM/WFS cost shares.

The clerk asked for closing silence, recognizing that some good work is underway and hoping we can care for one another with unconditional love.
