Climate Change is a PYM-wide witness following approvals by the body at 2021 Spring and Annual Sessions. Federal action is needed now to successfully address climate change. *All climate related elements* of *the proposed budget framework for reconciliation* are important, but the 100% Clean Electricity climate related elements Standard and the Clean Energy and Sustainability Accelerator are especially important to reach net-zero carbon emissions by 2050.

All Friends, now is the time to act: contact your federal senators and representatives. Ask them to insist that both the 100% Clean Electricity Standard (CES) and the Clean Energy Accelerator are included in the reconciliation bill to be voted on this fall. 
